#### Give Thanks to God

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:4-7

There is a song we sing in worship "Give Thanks". The opening line is "Give thanks with a grateful heart, give thanks to the Holy One, give thanks because he's given Jesus Christ his Son." This is a response to an expression of our faith as we reflect on how God has given to us over the year. As we look over the year, we can all say we have ups and downs in our everyday lives. There have been stresses that have put pressure on us regarding the decisions we make in regards to our everyday living. In all of this, we can point to the joys that reaffirm our hope in our God, who blesses us with ways that lift us from our sorrows and grief and give us strength when we feel we don't know how we are going to manage the difficulties of everyday living. That gives us guidance to make decisions that will be best for ourselves and those we love and care for. This is the key message in the opening line of the

When we approach and relate to God with such an attitude of faith, we discover how these joys and, yes, miracles come to us. We see the blessings of hope and fulfillment in the strangers that greet us or share an act of

kindness. We know God is present when a surprise email or card reaches us with a word of encouragement or comfort. We are uplifted when a small act on our part to offer help to another returns to us with more joy than we even knew could be possible and didn't look for. In the letter to the Colossians, Paul writes, "As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving."

The second phrase of "Give Thanks" is "and now let the weak say, 'I am strong'; let the poor say, 'I am rich because of what the Lord has done for us'." Giving thanks is a verb, an action in how we live our faith, the action of praising God in Worship, and the action of giving to support our Church so that we can continue to offer a place of hope and provide help to those who come to our doors looking for a home. The action of reaching out to care for others in our homes, neighborhoods, and the world through our support of the missions that engage with the poor and weak, the hurting and sick, the outcast and voiceless in our society. We praise God by serving in the life of our **Church Home.** As we look to 2024, I ask you to pray about where you might serve in the coming year. Your gifts and abilities might lead you to serve on a committee or ministry team. You might find joy in serving in worship as an usher, greeter, liturgist, the **Tech Team, or in the choir.** You may be stirred to help with the 4 KIDS MINISTRY or with fellowship ministries. Contact me if any of these or other opportunities to serve stir a passion within you.

Giving Thanks is one main expression of our faith in response to the Grace and Love God demonstrated by the example of God's son, Jesus the Christ. This year, during the season of Advent, noting a time of waiting and preparation for the birth of Christ, beginning the first Sunday of December and going through Christmas, we will be offering our Stewardship campaign, <u>Striving to End Spiritual and Physical Hunger</u>, as we anticipate a new year in which we can continue to Give Thanks to God by our giving.

By giving thanks and responding to God's Love and Grace, we can ensure that we continue to be a strong and vital presence for Christ's love in this community as an Inclusive, Reconciling, and Affirming Congregation, where all are Welcome.

I want to thank you for all who have given generously so far this year and ask you to pray to give a generous gift to the Church as we close the year so that we might end the year strong moving into 2024.

#### **Advent Wreath Making Breakfast** for


Homebound and our Church Family on Saturday, November 11th.


#### Special Guest Speaker that will move and inspire you!

**Housing** - A rent-reduced, shared-living stay on our campus for up to 14 moms and their children at a time. Families live three to a house with a combination of private and shared space.

**Education** - During their two-vear stay, women are equipped with resources, mentoring, accountability, education, and community connections designed to empower them and their children to sustainably thrive.

Accountability - Village residents commit and are held accountable to living agreements that ensure safety and enable the thriving growth of all, including moms, kids, staff, and volunteers. These include responsible and supportive co-living, active participation in weekly classes, progress and followthrough toward set goals, clear and honest communication with the advocacy team, and a commitment to physical and emotional safety.
