A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DREW

It is September 10th as I write this article for the church newsletter, and I do so with a heart filled with peace, joy, and hope. The weekend of September 7/8 held many blessings in the life of Temecula UMC—blessings that both built bridges for new relationships and allowed us to construct strategies and visions for future adventures of the church.

It was my blessing to spend time in conversation with many friends as part of our first "pastor's retreat" together. We followed a very basic format for this time of conversation:

- 1. What do you call Christ? (Mark 8:27-29)
- 2. How do we interact with Christ? (Mark 11:22-24)
- 3. Sharing our experience with others (Matthew 28:19-20)

During this time of conversation, we had the opportunity to learn more about our worship community and to learn a little more about ourselves. Anytime we have the opportunity to share our life journeys, we relive those journeys. We are granted an opportunity to stir a fire that we hope will continue to blaze with passion and care.

Following this time of self-reflection, I asked our community to take one more step. Many years ago, I was asked a compelling question by a seminary professor: "Do you ever take the time to look at your congregation

Our community that day spent some extra time speaking through all of their previous answers with the compelling prayer, "Who are we not reaching?" When we actively live Christ's words in Matthew 28, what nations have we not reached yet? These answers became the mission field we need to address.

I would like for you to take a moment, a week, even a month to look at your everyday life. We connect more with the individuals we spend time with, and we are transformed by the stories we experience in our daily lives. I would like for us all to take a time of extended prayer and ask the question, "Who am I missing?" This answer becomes our mission fields.

On that same day, we had the opportunity to celebrate a first. We spent time in multiple age groupings, multiple areas of faith growth, and relaxed with music, crafts, and community for 2GETHER. It was my blessing to have the opportunity to play my guitar and participate in the conversation of the evening. I will include pictures below for all to see the excitement of the weekend.



The LGBTQIA+ Ministry continues to be active during the month. The Amplify Group continues to meet weekly on Thursday night at 6:30 PM. We continue to encourage members of our church family to attend these meetings when they can. The meetings consist of Christian and Bible studies pertaining to the LGBTQIA+ community, as well as community support.

We recently hosted, during our Amplify gathering, a viewing of the film "For The Bible Tells Me So." This film was produced in the early 2000s and follows the lives of different families weighing their faith against the care of family members who identify as LGBTQ. This film also explores the career of Gene Robinson, who was the first LGBTQ Episcopal Bishop.

Beginning in October, the Amplify group will start an Affirming Theology series that will look at our church's affirming journey in contrast with the scriptures that have been used and presented in a more restrictive role.

Work has begun with Dr. Denyse Barns of the California Pacific Annual Conference to host a presentation in 2025 on "What An Affirming Church Looks Like." We ask that you be in prayer as these conversations continue to take place and as the work being done to construct this program progresses. It is our hope to have this gathering open to other community churches and our annual conference.
