

### **GREETINGS FROM PASTOR DREW**

Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ in our time of transition as we move closer to our ministry time together in Temecula.

As we move through this time of transition, I know there is an element of grieving for us all. On June 18, 2016, I stood on the stage of the Chapel of the University of Redlands to be ordained as a full Elder of the California Pacific Annual Conference. That evening standing with me was a person who had not just been my mentor through the last months of my ordination process, but one who was also a friend I had spent time with at Sierra Service Project and talked about baseball with: Reverend Rick Malec. I know Pastor Rick has done many beautiful things for the worship community of TUMC. I join you in a moment of celebrating a well-deserved retirement for a dear mentor, pastor, and friend, even as we feel sadness for the loss of his daily presence at TUMC.

All places of injustice will intertwine from time to time. I am excited to explore with the community, like Paul, to interact with the community. I pray we will find ways to be visible in the community. Whether it be in places of food or housing insecurity, interacting as a visible support for our LGTBQIA+ siblings, or just being in the community, we can display a worship community where anyone can join in, have fun, and be filled. I am excited about these opportunities to serve and worship together.

I know this journey will take time. I pray you will also be willing to be on this journey of trust and relationship building with me with patience and understanding. Even within my passion projects, it will take time to build trust and understanding to implement them. In any practice of service or worship, I hope we spend time in conversation together to share the vision, weigh out its possibilities, and invest in the opportunity together. There will be many things that will develop during our journey. We will approach each other with great excitement. Even in the excitement, we need to ensure we are genuinely taking care of the actual needs. In every area of justice care, there are visible needs we want to change, but there are also underlying needs that carry the heaviest weight. The journey of time and conversation uncovers the real burdens and opens the doors for actual care.

I am excited to share so much of my story with you and to see how our stories flow through each other in worship, ministry, and service. I look forward to sharing music with you, having conversations about popular culture, drinking coffee (lots and lots of coffee), attending school board meetings, attending community events, and introducing you to my wife Gretchen and my children, Annie and Hunter. I am excited to see the possibilities that may still need to come to light. For now, I hold you in prayer. Deeply enjoy and celebrate this time of worship and service with Pastor Rick. Make more memories and celebrate your time in the community together. It will be my blessing to join you in July.


# Welcome Pastor Drew



# The Creature from Jekyll Island



Purchasing Scrip cards is a simple way of raising money for the church budget. Simply



purchase gift cards at face value and the church receives a percentage of the sales. The Scrip box has a variety of cards including gas, stores and restaurants. 

*Housing* - A rent-reduced, shared-living stay on our campus for up to 14 moms and their children at a time. Families live three to a house with a combination of private and shared space.

*Education -* During their two-year stay, women are equipped with resources, mentoring, accountability, education, and community connections designed to empower them and their children to sustainably thrive.

*Accountability* - Village residents commit and are held accountable to living agreements that ensure safety and enable the thriving growth of all, including moms, kids, staff, and volunteers. These include responsible and supportive co-living, active participation in weekly classes, progress and followthrough toward set goals, clear and honest communication with the advocacy team, and a commitment to physical and emotional safety.
