

For me, this time of preparation has been laced with both hope and some anxiety over the years. I see our journey into the church conference not just as an administrative action positioning church leaders, but as the beginning steps of ministry, evaluating who we proclaim to be to the communities in the Temecula Valley.

Each decision we make during this time of conversation enables us to build a foundation that communicates to our community: this is who we are. In some places, this is easily seen. We select leaders with specific gifts to work together in ministries and touch souls. We make decisions that support our staff and make it possible for them to work, serve, and care. We empower volunteers to be the hands and feet that become the welcoming faces representing our church. It is easy to see the ministry in these areas. I would like for you to pray more deeply this year. There are places we may not have viewed as voices of our ministry that speak louder about our mission and our path than we might realize. As we journey through a time of stewardship, we look at our church's overall budget for what it displays about our mission and our focus on ministry. How does our mission budget reflect how we care for the world? How does our facility budget display our desire to create a welcoming environment for new faces stepping onto our campus? When we pray through the usage of our beautiful campus, what symbols and signage do we have that demonstrate we are welcoming and

affirming to all who enter? This is not limited to our LGBTQIA+ siblings but also includes our siblings with physical disabilities, cognitive delays, and the questions we may at times find hard to answer.

As we go through this first season together preparing for our all-church conference, I want you to know these are the things I am praying about, and I hope you will join me in prayer over them as well. When I first met with Temecula's SPRC, I shared in that conversation that whenever I am asked if something can be done, I would respond, "Please share with me how this is ministry." If we maintain a ministry focus in all our activities, we will begin to see the grandeur of how and where God is reaching.

We already have so much to be grateful for: a new Saturday night opportunity, the growth of music with the handbell choir and new soloists, our participation with community groups such as the Temecula and Murrieta Interfaith, and having a presence at events such as the Temecula Valley School Board, Stephen Ministry Care, Prayers and Squares, our Amplify small group, Tuesday Women's Bible Study, UWF, Youth Group, Sunday School, and so many others. These celebrations will grow, and it is my honor to be with you on this journey to prepare for them.

Please be aware we will also be holding our All Church Conference on December 1st at 12:30pm. We are required by the Book of Discipline to give you one month notice and many of you have already received emails for reports. The Rev. Saul Montiel will be presiding.

On October 11th, members of our Amplify Thursday night group went out to the community to raise awareness of National Coming Out Day. Please enjoy these pictures.






West With Giraffes
