

The LGBTQIA+ Ministry continues to be active during the month. The Amplify Group continues to meet weekly on Thursday night at 6:30pm. We continue to encourage members of our church family to attend these meetings when they can. The meetings consist of Christian and Bible studies pertaining to the LGBTQIA+ community, as well as community support.



We recently hosted screenings of the films "1946: The Misinterpretation That Reshaped Culture" and "Mama Bears."

The video "1946: The Misinterpretation That Reshaped Culture" was a significant outreach effort for TUMC with support from Temecula community leaders and it was more than just a movie screening. It was an educational event that demonstrated our desire to be active caretakers.

"Mama Bears" was a film about the Mama Bear organization, how it was created, and what they do. Mama Bears are well-known for their "Mom Hugs," which involve going out into the community and helping LGBTQIA+ people who have been rejected by their families.

In July we took part in the highly popular Gay Pride Parade in San Diego. There were over 250 marching units, and over 250,000 people turned out. I was pleased to see a number of Methodist



churches in our area participating in the parade. I was also able to attend the Pride Festival in Balboa Park. I'm happy to report that a lot of churches were present to support the community. As always, both heartwarming and wrenching... At least for me, one of the event's highlights was the Moms and Dads Hugs Group. This is a group of mothers and fathers who provide free hugs to people of the community, many of whom have been isolated from their families.

Housing - A rent-reduced, shared-living stay on our campus for up to 14 moms and their children at a time. Families live three to a house with a combination of private and shared space.

Education - During their two-year stay, women are equipped with resources, mentoring, accountability, education, and community connections designed to empower them and their children to sustainably thrive.

Accountability - Village residents commit and are held accountable to living agreements that ensure safety and enable the thriving growth of all, including moms, kids, staff, and volunteers. These include responsible and supportive co-living, active participation in weekly classes, progress and follow-through toward set goals, clear and honest communication with the advocacy team, and a commitment to physical and emotional safety.



El Porvenir believes all people deserve clean water, safe sanitation, and the knowledge to sustain it for the generations to follow. We partner with the people of Nicaragua so that they can build a better future for themselves through the sustainable development of Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WaSH) education projects.
