Rick's Ramblings

This Is the Beginning

Ecclesiastes offers us some very familiar words from chapter 3, *“For everything, there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted... a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh...”* (vs. 1-4)

These passages talk about endings and beginnings. The end of life but also the beginning of life and life renewed. When we come to the end of a part of our life, a stage of our life, an experience of our life we grieve that part of that life. The loss and void that it leaves in us. It is a part that we probably won't be able to get back or relive. When we lose a loved one as they die and are no longer physically with us, we will no longer have them with us to talk to, laugh with, to be with. This grief brings pain and a sense of loss and at times great depression.

But losing a loved one isn't the only loss that brings on these same feelings. Even growing from one stage of our lives to another, moving from childhood to teenager, to young adult, adulthood, and older adult. We at times look back for the good old days. There are many experiences that we have had and lose that we want to grieve to recapture.

What we long for in our lives today is to get back to normalcy before the Covid 19 Pandemic invaded the world and threw our lives into frantic confusion and desperation. We seek to have a time of peace within our communities where all

are included and welcomed and there is no struggle for control and dominance in our government. We hope for a time of doing what is right and just for all people.

This passage from the writer of Ecclesiastes teaches us that though there are times in our lives that cause mourning, pain, and struggle this is not the end. We are given opportunities to realize hope, celebrate life, receive gifts that bring joy and love for ourselves and for all humanity.

We are coming to the end of another year. One that at its beginning we thought, due to the Covid restrictions, would drag on and bring about more despair and darkness. Yes, there has been some continued despair, difficulties, and hurt due to Covid and the division within our society but there have also been times of joy and laughter, renewed hope and the realization of new life and possibilities to grow as our community, family, and Church Family.

As we come to the end of another year, I want to share some endings that lead to beginnings.

On Sunday, November 7, during our Worship Service, we will be celebrating the Saints of our lives that have left us but have entered the Church Triumphant. We will celebrate those who have passed in the last year from our Church Family, those in our own families, and our friends. We will celebrate those who have passed in previous years. However, family of students are required to pay nominal school fees, all school supplies, such as pencils, pens, paper, books, etc. The Student Scholarship fund is used for students (K-University) who are unable to attend school because their families cannot afford to pay these school expenses. Scholarships are given to children who live in an area where the "Guatemala Mission Project" has completed service projects in the highlands of Guatemala (Chichicastenango, Guatemala) Students in need of scholarship are identified by their teachers and School Director. Parents can also contact a local "Guatemala Mission Project Leader" regarding their need.



It is with joy I share with you the marvelous Monica. She was born on Camp Pendleton and adopted at birth. She was the first of four adopted children in her family! It was a loving and close family. They are all still in Southern California. They grew up in San Diego, except when her dad went to Montana.

It was a Catholic family. Monica went through school, including high school, in Catholic schools. She attended San Diego State for a time, studying English. Her family was active in their church. Her mom was the choir director and her dad was head usher. Now her parents are active on the Coronado United Methodist Church. She smiles as she says, “we converted them.”

33 years ago, mutual friends introduced her to Mark, and they were married 31 years ago.

She began looking for something more in her spiritual life than the very structured Catholic Church. Monica shared that she came to believe that one’s spiritual journey is very personal. She found her way to the La Mesa First United Methodist Church. She found that the Methodist Church gave her more flexibility. She found a spiritual home. She and Mark were very active there.

They have been members here in Temecula for 27 years. David French baptized their son Matt. Mark became the youth group director in 1998, and Monica was a part of his team. She particularly enjoyed taking the youth on SSP trips and giving them an understanding of the challenges of poverty, including driving to get a container of water for the day. Monica has been on the Board of Trustees twice, including presently. She was team leader on 4 fundraising galas. She sang in the choir here and wants to do so again as time permits. Monica believes that music is an important part of the liturgy.

As a family, they enjoy trips. Recently they went to Kentucky and the Bourbon Trail. They go to local wineries, not just the one hosting Great Scott BBQ. In 2022 the family plans to visit Scotland. They plan to also see Italy and take a train ride through Alaska in the future. They look forward to being able to travel again post Covid.

Monica enjoys reading, particularly fiction. For a time, she volunteered as backstage crew for Temecula Old Town Theater. She also loves to cook for people. As the children were growing up, their friends congregated at the McCullough home, and we all know how much teenagers like to eat. Catering was a natural transition from cooking at home for others to cooking professionally. They keep busy not only at the catering venue at the winery, but also for weddings, for other celebrations and the monthly fund raising meals for our church. This is the big wedding season in Temecula, with the usual great autumn and winter weather.

Monica is also the office manager for a financial planner. For the past year and a half she has been working from home on the computer. She only goes in to the office one morning a week. This gives her a lot of flexibility in her schedule, so it melds well with her active catering jobs.

The family has always been the center of Monica’s life. She fondly recalls that she could walk to her grandparents’ home when she was a child. Her church family is her extended family. She is thankful for the live streaming during Covid, although it is not the same as in person worship, we could at least keep in touch. It was a big deal figuring out how to do it. She credits Meghann with her tech savviness to make it happen.

She shared a bit of her spiritual philosophy. The spiritual journey is personal, and we need to respect one another’s journey. If people would just love one another, it would be a better world. When you’re out of sorts, take a deep breath, step back and see more clearly. Do unto others as you would like done unto you. You are going to get back what you put out.

Monica’s message to our church is—Thank you for being part of my family and letting me be part of yours. It is nice to know you are there!
