Rick's Ramblings

Stewardship, Apportionments and Other Money Matters

I have heard a number of times over my many years of ministry from church members and those searching for a church: "The church shouldn't talk so much about money." "All the church does is ask for money." Do you know...

- Jesus talked about money more than He did Heaven and Hell combined.
- Jesus talked about money more than anything else except the Kingdom of God.
- 11 of 39 parables talk about money. One of every seven verses in the Gospel of *Luke* talks about money. The word "money" is actually used in connection with Jesus (whether He used the word or it was used in connection with Him) approximately 25 times throughout the Gospel accounts in *Matthew*, *Mark*, *Luke* and *John*. Now, I must admit Jesus only asked for money to be given directly in one place, the young rich man to whom Jesus said that he must do one more thing "to inherit the Kingdom of God, go and sell all that you have and give to the poor."

What I believe Jesus was doing by talking about money was teaching us how to be good stewards of our money, to use it for the care of the hurting, hungry, the homeless, the sick, and all in need. Jesus also taught and demonstrated how we are to trust God to provide and that we can use our money and resources for the caring of God's children. Such was the widow who "gave out of her poverty, put in everything - all she had to live on."

First, I want to give thanks and praise to God for all of you who have given to the ministry and missions of this church to date. We have served and cared for many through our annual giving, our Golden Basket offerings, and our special offerings to help those hit by disasters. I share this as a way of offering an accounting of our stewardship as a congregation, where we are now financially, and what to look forward to.

At the end of September the giving by those who offered a *Faith Giving Pledge Card* for 2015 was behind by \$5000. You should receive another quarterly statement shortly to let you know where you are in your giving for the year. When you get it, pray about your giving for the end of the year. If you are able to offer an extra gift, this would be greatly appreciated. Trust in God if your circumstances have changed. But give as you can. God will bless all of us in our giving.

Part of our missional giving within our budget is what is known as "apportionments". Many of you may not know what this means or may think it is a required denominational "tax" on our church. I believe the term "apportionment" is an outdated and misunderstood word. More appropriate would be our denominational asking to support the larger mission of the church beyond our local community and to support the work of the local church. Does this include salaries and running the facilities at our Conference and District level? Yes. But this is no different than paying for salaries and running of our facilities at our local church supporting and enabling the ministry of Christ in our community. Did you know our camping ministry is supported by our giving to the Conference? We support education for those both locally and globally who would not receive an education due to of lack of income. We help support churches who need a pastor so they can be the presence of Christ in less advantaged communities.

Our denominational asking for 2015 was \$38,385, which was a part of our annual budget. As a part of your giving we have been advancing a portion of monthly contributions. But in order not to hurt our other ministries we have not been paying the denominational asking in full. To date we have paid 48% of our asking. We still owe \$19,900 with two months to go.

Yes, many would say after reading what I have shared in these last two items that this is not good news. But I am confident that God is with us and blesses our journey and knows that this congregation is faithful. We have been blessed in so many ways. It is God who will help us to continue to be good stewards. Remember Jesus wasn't talking about money to make anyone feel

guilty. He was helping us understand where our resources come from, how we are to use them to offer the love and care of God in real concrete ways, and how we are to trust and believe that God will provide.

Finally, I want to share with you that beginning November 22nd, we will kick off our Stewardship Program. The theme this year is "Catch the Joy". Let us be in prayer as we look forward to continuing and growing our ministries and mission for 2016.
