

Acts 20:24

However, I consider my life worth nothing to me; my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the good news of God’s grace.

You might be asking yourself, “What is the connection between the three sets of words in the above article title?” I’ve been asked by some directly or indirectly why should I invite my friends, neighbors, or family to the Grow with the Spirit, A Family Gathering weekend on September 28 and 29? Why should I post a flyer at my local Starbucks or grocery store bulletin board? 

OPPORTUNITY FOR GIVING

In an effort to share information about the many opportunities for those in our Congregation to offer their gifts, the Finance Committee has this information on IRA Charitable Rollover Gift. We hope this information is helpful as you look for ways to share gifts to support the ministries and mission of our church.

Benefits of making an IRA Charitable Rollover Gift

Per the tax code, if you are over 70½ and have an IRA you must begin taking annual distributions from your IRA. These distributions are called RMD's (Required Minimum Distributions) and are subject to income taxes.

But, there is a way to avoid income taxes on these distributions. You can make donation to the Church by making a OCD (Qualified Charitable Contribution). Currently, the donation is limited to \$100,000 per year.

Benefits:

- 1 Donation can satisfy your annual RMD requirement up to the amount of your gift.
- 2 Allows you to give from pre-tax assets and exclude the distribution from taxable income.
- 3 Helps avoid limitations on charitable deductions and the potential exposure to higher tax brackets.
- 4 It is simple and easy to do, simply notify your IRA Custodian.
- 5 Minimizes the effect on your cash flow. The gift comes from your assets not your checking account.

Rules:

To complete a qualified charitable distribution (OCD) from an IRA to a charity, the IRA owner must:

Already be age 70½ on the *date of distribution*.

Submit a distribution form to the IRA custodian, requesting that the check be made payable *directly* to the charity.

Ensure that no tax withholding is being done from the OCD to the charity (as the money must go *to* the charity to qualify, and as a non-taxable distribution no withholding should be necessary).

Send the check directly *to* the charity, or to the IRA owner to be forwarded along to the charity.

While the process of completing a OCD to a charity is fairly straightforward, the key administrative requirement is that the distribution check must be made payable *directly* to the charitable entity. If the funds go to the IRA owner and are then passed along *to* the charity, it is *still a taxable* distribution to the IRA owner and *not a OCD*.

Under IRS Notice 2007-7, Q&A-41, it *is* permitted for the check to be *mailed* to the IRA owner, as long as the check is payable *to* the charity, but a check payable to the IRA owner that is merely endorsed over to the charity does not satisfy the OCD requirements.

The above is for information only. Contact your tax preparer or accountant for your particular situation.
